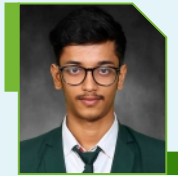

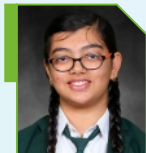

I was watching this BBC report on Auschwitz survivors who returned after 75 years for a memorial ceremony on 27th January 2020, to the very same concentration camp that changed their lives. The survivors shared their experiences which made me wonder how man can preserve his spiritual freedom and independence of mind in such terrible conditions of physical and psychological stress.

Celebrated Austrian psychiatrist and Holocaust survivor Viktor Frankl in his psychological memoir 'Mans search for Meaning' - tells that

the gruesome experience of Auschwitz taught him about the primary purpose of life. For Frankl, meaning came from three possible sources: purposeful work, love, and courage in the face of difficulty.

He says, man does have a choice of action. Everything can be taken from a man, but one thing: the last of the human freedoms — to choose one's attitude in any given set of circumstances, to choose one's own way.

Lenga, who was 17 when he entered the camp in summer 1944, survived by making

woollen jackets for SS guards. He later went on to become a successful tailor in Beverly Hills. He said he had refused to let the Holocaust define his life, despite the fact it claimed 98 members of his family.

It's always possible to overcome a tough situation through out of the box thinking, and not give in to the only options you think you have to pick from.

Every day, every hour, offers you the opportunity to make a decision, a decision which determines whether you would or would not submit to those powers which threatened to rob

you of your very self, your inner freedom.

We, as educationists; get a chance to live by those principles every day. A purposeful work of shaping the future of the nation in our own little way, showing love by recognizing and appreciating the diversity in our learners and being valiant by doing something more important than 'I'. The real happiness lies in it, for happiness cannot be pursued, you have to let it happened

### INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION

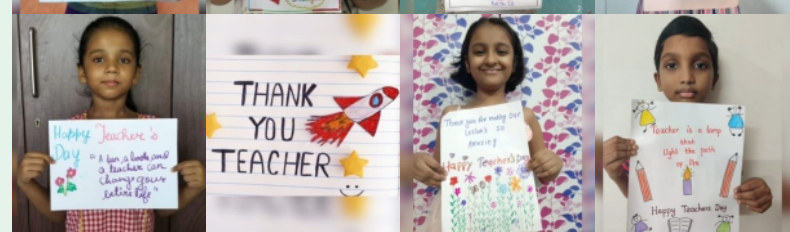

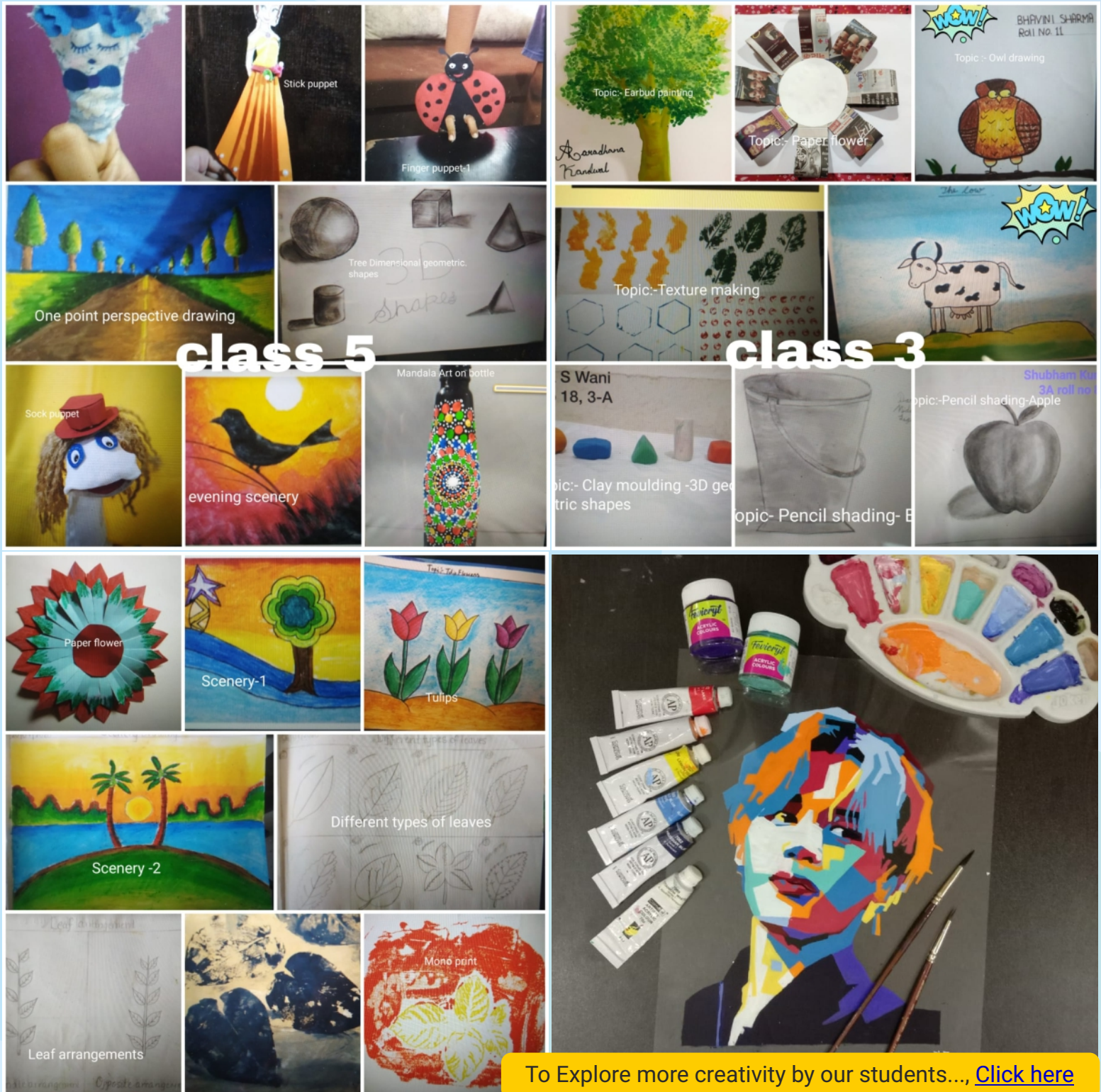
### TEACHERS DAY CELEBRATION
